1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

A quarter of respondents in Slovenia consider climate change to be the most serious problem facing the world (25%, +8 percentage points since 2013), among the highest in the EU.

Almost half say that business and industry are responsible for tackling climate change: 48%, 13 percentage points above the EU average, higher than the score for the national government (32%) or the European Union (34%).


More than seven in ten respondents say they have personally taken some action to fight climate change in the past six months (72%, EU average: 49%). In fact, when specific actions are mentioned, nearly all respondents (99%) said they had taken at least one action. Examples include:

- 86% try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (+7 percentage points since 2013)
- 73% try to cut down the consumption of disposable items whenever possible (+13 percentage points since 2013)
- 58% buy locally produced and seasonal food whenever possible (+14 percentage points since 2013)


There is strong support for national action to improve energy efficiency (95%) and increase the use of renewable energy by 2030 (92%). Some 95% agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.





QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)






QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

QA4.1 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?


Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)



Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)



Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)





(%)


